BOARD'S NEW LICENSE DATABASE SYSTEM IS ACTIVE

The Board's new Thentia license database system's Application portal and Licensee portal have been active since late last year. Thentia is a company used by many licensing boards in Nevada and throughout the country. The goal of the new system is to implement a more user-friendly interface for licensees, staff, the Board and the public.

Several features of the new licensing system include the following: 1) licensees will create and manage their own accounts (including initial applications and renewals); 2) pay all fees on the website; and, 3) facilitate staff administrative tasks, such as running reports and managing complaints and other documents.

NOTE: Be advised that licensees are now required to upload and manage CME certificates every year prior to the end of each renewal year and licensees will be able to track credits!!!! Also, for your reference, instructions for use of the new Licensee portal are attached to the end of this Newsletter.

Important License Renewal Note!

In September-October 2024, the Board will begin emailing license renewal notices to all licensees. NOTE that the email will be sent from <u>noreply@thentiacloud.com</u> so please be sure to add this email address to your contacts or safe senders list to ensure that it does not get filtered into your spam or junk folder.

It is critically important for ALL licensees to keep the Board updated with their current email addresses in order to receive important information, such as license renewal notices, from the Board. Failure to do so may result in the imposition of late payment fees.

In the event you need to update your official email address with the Board, or if you do not have an email address, you should immediately contact either Nikki Montano or Carrie Klein by calling the Board office at 702-732-2147. You may also update your official email address by accessing your file through the Licensee portal.

http://nsbom.org/LicensingPublic/lice Licensees' Obligation to Complete Death Certificates

The person who is required to certify the cause of death shall complete the portions of the death certificate pertaining to the cause of death and the certification of death within fortyeight (48) hours after being assigned as the certifier. Any death certificate rejected for not containing a certification of cause of death, lack of information or lack of certifier signature must be completed by the certifier within twenty-four (24) hours after such rejection. Please review NAC 440.160 for more information. A licensee's failure to timely submit the required death certificate information may be grounds for discipline. See, NRS 633.131(1)(p) and NAC 633.350(1)(d).

Licensees' Duty to Report Criminal Action

Failure of a licensee to report to the Board in writing, within thirty (30) days, any criminal action taken or conviction obtained against the licensee, other than a minor traffic violation, in this State or any other state or by the Federal Government, a branch of the Armed Forces of the United States or any local or federal jurisdiction of a foreign country is grounds for the Board to initiate disciplinary action against the licensee. See, NRS 633.511(1)(q).

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

CME REQUIREMENTS FOR D.O. AND P.A. LICENSEES

CME requirements for Osteopathic Physicians, control+click CME Requirements NV Osteopathic Physician

CME requirements for Physician Assistants, control+click CME Requirements NV Physician Assistants

NOTE: Effective January 1, 2024, Osteopathic Physicians and Physician Assistants who provide or supervise emergency medical services in a hospital or primary care are required to complete CME consisting of two (2) credit hours in the stigma, discrimination and unrecognized bias toward persons who have acquired or at high risk of acquiring human immunodeficiency virus. This is a ONE TIME CME requirement and must be completed within two (2) years after beginning to provide such services. ("Primary care" means the practice of family medicine, pediatrics, internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology and midwifery.)

CME AUDIT PROCESS

The Continuing Medical Education (CME) Audit Policy has been revised. See below.

1) CME audits will remain random, with the goal of all licensees being audited at least once every five (5) years, possibly more depending on the random choice;

2) CME fines are NO longer charged for those with deficient CME credits;

3) Audited licensees must prove they took all required CMEs for the previous year to renew their license; and,

4) If proof is not provided after receiving a final notification letter for renewal, a licensee's license will automatically expire pursuant to the provisions of NRS 633.481 and NAC 633.257(1).

TO ALL LICENSEES: Remember to provide to the Board either your residence address or regularly checked P.O. Box number as well as your current email address to ensure receiving important information from the Board. BUSINESS, PRACTICE OR LICENSING CREDENTIALLING OFFICE ADDRESSES ARE NOT TO BE USED as they are not reliable destinations to receive or manage mail.

SUPERVISION OF PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

NOTE: ALL physician assistants MUST be supervised IN PERSON for the first 30 days of working with every Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine with whom they have a cooperating agreement. The statute, NRS 633.469(3), states: "A supervising osteopathic physician shall provide supervision to his or her physician assistant in person at all times during the first 30 days that the supervising osteopathic physician supervises the physician assistant. The provisions of this subsection do not apply to a federally qualified health center." Additionally, Regulation NAC 633.289(3)(a) states: "Except as otherwise provided in NRS 633.469, a supervising physician shall provide supervision in person at least once each month to the physician assistant."

Substance Use Disorders and Addiction Education to Meet New DEA Requirements

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 enacted a new one-time requirement which **went into effect as of June 27, 2023** for any Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)-registered practitioner (except for veterinarians) to complete eight hours of training "on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders."

Many U.S. states already require physicians and other medical professionals to complete CME hours on safer prescribing of opioids. This new requirement asks physicians to have additional education on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders.

If you have not met this specific eight-hour training requirement yet, the deadline to do so is the date of a practitioner's next scheduled DEA registration submission.

Strategies for Prescribing Opioids for the Management of Pain

At its April 2024 meeting, the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) House of Delegates adopted a policy regarding strategies for prescribing opioids for the management of pain. The strategies and recommendations in the policy are intended as a helpful resource to state medical and osteopathic boards in assessing clinicians' management of pain in their patients and whether opioids are or were used in a medically appropriate way. The guidance contained in the policy is not meant to establish a standard of care, but rather to encourage a responsible, patient-centered and compassionate approach to caring for patients with pain.
