NEW LICENSE DATABASE SYSTEM 2025 LEGISLATIVE CHANGES AFFECTING LICENSEES

BOARD'S NEW LICENSE DATABASE SYSTEM IS ACTIVE

The Board's new Thentia license database system's Application portal and Licensee portal have been active since late 2023. The Board has also added Anesthesiologist Assistant licenses to our license database.

Several features of the new licensing system include the following: 1) licensees will create and manage their own accounts (including initial applications and renewals); 2) pay all fees on the website; and, 3) facilitate staff administrative tasks, such as running reports and managing complaints and other documents.

NOTE: Be advised that licensees are now required to upload and manage CME certificates every year prior to the end of each renewal year and licensees will be able to track credits!!!! See **"CE Integration Coming Soon"** on the next page for more information. Also, for your reference, instructions for use of the new Licensee portal are attached to the end of this Newsletter.

Important License Renewal Note!

Beginning in September 2025, license renewal notices will be emailed to all licensees. **NOTE that the email will be sent from noreply@thentiacloud.com so please be sure to add this email address to your contacts or safe senders list to ensure that it does not get filtered into your spam or junk folder. LATE FEES** will be assessed for licensees who fail to renew by the deadline of December 31, 2025!

It is critically important for ALL licensees to keep the Board updated with their current email addresses in order to receive important information, such as license renewal notices, from the Board. Failure to do so may result in the imposition of late payment fees.

In the event you need to update your official email address with the Board, or if you do not have an email address, you should immediately contact either Nikki Montano or Carrie Klein by calling the Board office at 702-732-2147. You may also update your official email address by accessing your file through the Licensee portal.

2025 Legislative Changes Affecting Licensees

AB 56 was signed into law by Governor Lombardo on May 26, 2025.

Some of the provisions of that bill affect the Board's licensees' CME requirements, licensing renewal periods, and licensing fees.

In general, starting in 2026, D.O. licenses will be renewed every even-numbered year for a two-year period. Starting in 2027, P.A. licenses will be renewed every odd-numbered year for a two-year period.

Also, CME requirements have been changed for D.O.s to 40 hours every two years, beginning January 1, 2027. CME requirements for P.A.s have also changed to 40 hours every two years, beginning January 1, 2028. Charts setting forth these changes will soon be posted to the Board's website under "CME Requirements" tab.

License renewal fees for D.O.s and P.A.s will also be increased effective with the first biennial license renewal. A chart setting forth the revised licensing fees will be posted when effective to the Board's website under the "Licensee Services" tab. **NRS 633.311(1)(c)(3)** is amended effective January 1, 2026, to allow certain residents who have completed 24 months of postgraduate training to obtain a D.O. license.

Integration of CE Broker with our Thentia license database system is almost complete. Be on the lookout for emails from the Board and/or CE Broker with instructions on how to create an account and use CE Broker. CE Broker is a product that offers a continuing education tracking system with reporting and tracking features.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

CME REQUIREMENTS FOR D.O., P.A., and A.A. LICENSEES

NOTE: Effective January 1, 2024, Osteopathic Physicians and Physician Assistants who provide or supervise emergency medical services in a hospital or primary care are required to complete CME consisting of two (2) credit hours in the stigma, discrimination and unrecognized bias toward persons who have acquired or at high risk of acquiring human immunodeficiency virus. This is a ONE TIME CME requirement and must be completed within two (2) years after beginning to provide such services. ("Primary care" means the practice of family medicine, pediatrics, internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology and midwifery.)

CME AUDIT PROCESS

The Continuing Medical Education (CME) Audit Policy has been revised. See below.

- 1) CME audits will remain random, with the goal of all licensees being audited at least once every five (5) years, possibly more depending on the random choice;
- 2) CME fines are NO longer charged for those with deficient CME credits;
- 3) Audited licensees must prove they took all required CMEs for the previous year to renew their license; and,
- 4) If proof is not provided after receiving a final notification letter for renewal, a licensee's license will automatically expire pursuant to the provisions of NRS 633.481 and NAC 633.257(1).

TO ALL LICENSEES: Remember to provide to the Board either your residence address or regularly checked P.O. Box number as well as your current email address to ensure receiving important information from the Board. BUSINESS, PRACTICE OR LICENSING CREDENTIALLING OFFICE ADDRESSES ARE NOT TO BE USED as they are not reliable destinations to receive or manage mail.

SUPERVISION OF PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

NOTE: ALL physician assistants MUST be supervised IN PERSON for the first 30 days of working with every Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine with whom they have a cooperating agreement. The statute, NRS 633.469(3), states: "A supervising osteopathic physician shall provide supervision to his or her physician assistant in person at all times during the first 30 days that the supervising osteopathic physician supervises the physician assistant. The provisions of this subsection do not apply to a federally qualified health center." Additionally, Regulation NAC 633.289(3)(a) states: "Except as otherwise provided in NRS 633.469, a supervising physician shall provide supervision in person at least once each month to the physician assistant."

Board recognized as Wellbeing First Champion

The Board has been recognized as a Wellbeing First Champion for 2024 by ALL IN: Wellbeing First for Healthcare. On July 9, 2025, the Board received email notification that it will be awarded the Wellbeing First Champion for 2025 in September in recognition of Suicide Prevention Month. As a Wellbeing First Champion, the Board has verified that its licensure applications are free from intrusive and stigmatizing language around mental health care and treatment.

Verification that all such language around mental health has been removed is confirmed annually by ALL IN: Wellbeing First for Healthcare, a coalition of leading health care organizations, including the Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation, which works to eliminate barriers for health workers to obtain needed mental health care.

Substance Use Disorders and Addiction Education to Meet New DEA Requirements

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 enacted a new one-time requirement which **went into effect as of June 27, 2023** for any Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)-registered practitioner (except for veterinarians) to complete eight hours of training “on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders.”

Many U.S. states already require physicians and other medical professionals to complete CME hours on safer prescribing of opioids. This new requirement asks physicians to have additional education on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders.

If you have not met this specific eight-hour training requirement yet, the deadline to do so is the date of a practitioner's next scheduled DEA registration submission.

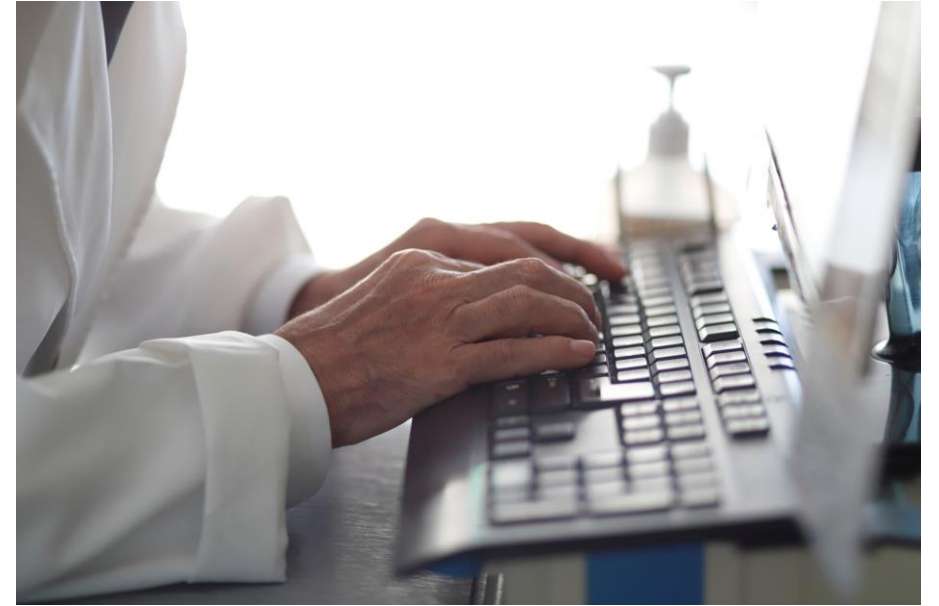
