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CME REQUIREMENTS

According to NRS 633.471, NAC 633.250, and NAC 633.285, see information, below, on continuing medical education (CME) requirements by the Board for Osteopathic Physicians and Physician Assistants.

PLEASE THOROUGHLY REVIEW REQUIREMENTS AS SOME MAY VARY BY YEAR

Osteopathic Physicians

- 1. ANNUAL: Total-35 credits: AT LEAST 10 credits in AOA category 1A or AMA category 1.
- 2. **EVEN YEARS ONLY: Two (2)** credits in **ethics, pain management or addiction care**. [NRS 633.471(7)]
- 3. **EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017 NEW SUICIDE PREVENTION REQUIREMENT: Two (2)** hours on evidence-based suicide prevention and awareness within TWO years of licensure; THEN two (2) hours completed every FOUR (4) years thereafter. [NRS 633.471(4) and (9)]
- 4. **AB 474-EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2018: REQUIRED ANNUALLY- Two (2) hours** of CMEs that relate to the misuse and abuse of controlled substances, the prescribing of opioids or addiction. [NAC 633.250(1)]
- 5. **AB 327 EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2022:** Psychiatrists and Physician Assistants practicing under the supervision of a Psychiatrist must biennially complete **two (2) hours** of CMEs in cultural competency and diversity, equity, and inclusion. [NRS 633.471(12)]

Continuing education can be obtained through annual conferences, the AOA or NOMA–sponsored events and meetings.

Physician Assistants

- **1. ANNUAL:** Completion of **20 hours** of annual continuing medical education completion required by the American Academy of Physician Assistants. [NAC 633.285(3)]
- **2. ANNUAL: UNDER AB474**-effective January 1, 2018-at least **2 hours** relating to the misuse and abuse of controlled substances, the prescribing of opioids or addiction.

The Board encourages the following to receive as part of his or her CME.

- Physicians Training concerning methods of educating patients about how to effectively manage medications, including, without limitation, the ability to request to have the symptom or purpose for which a drug is prescribed included on the label attached to the container of the drug,
- Physicians and Physician Assistants Training and education in the diagnosis of rare diseases, including, without limitation:
 - o (a) Recognizing the symptoms of pediatric cancer; and (b) Interpreting family history to determine whether such symptoms indicate a normal childhood illness or a condition that requires additional examination.
