## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption/Amendment of Regulations of the  
Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine

The Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine (Board) will hold a public hearing at 1:00 p.m., on April 16, 2026, at the Board's office located at 2275 Corporate Circle, Suite 210, Henderson, Nevada 89074. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption/amendment of regulations that pertain to Chapter 633 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC).

**R092-25** This regulation draft adds/amends requirements set forth in NAC Chapter 633 to conform to AB 56, legislation passed in the 2025 legislative session, relating to osteopathic medicine; making various conforming changes providing for biennial license renewals for certain licensees issued by the Board rather than the annual renewal of such licenses; making various conforming changes providing for continuing education requirements for osteopathic physicians and physician assistants necessary for renewals of such licenses; and makes conforming changes to the amount of various fees the Board may charge, including the fees for the issuance and renewal of a licenses as an osteopathic physician or physician assistant. A copy of the proposed regulation draft is attached to this notice for review.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. **The need for and the purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment:**

The proposed regulation is necessary to fully implement AB56 which was enacted by the Nevada Legislature in the 2025 Legislative Session, relating to osteopathic medicine; making various conforming changes providing for biennial license renewals for certain licensees issued by the Board rather than the annual renewal of such licenses; making various conforming changes providing for continuing education requirements for osteopathic physicians and physician assistants necessary for renewals of such licenses; and makes conforming changes to fees and the amount of various fees the Board may charge, including the fees for the issuance and renewal of a licenses as an osteopathic physician or physician assistant.

**2. If the proposed regulation is a temporary regulation, the terms or the substance of the proposed regulation to be adopted, amended or repealed, or a description of the subjects and the issues involved:**

The proposed regulation is not temporary.

**3. If the proposed regulation is a permanent regulation, a statement explaining how to obtain the approved or revised text of the proposed regulation:**

**4. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public:**

**a. Both adverse and beneficial effects:**

The Board does not believe that the proposed regulation will have an adverse economic effect on the business of the practice of osteopathic medicine, nor will it have an economic effect on the public. The Board does believe that the proposed regulation will have a beneficial effect on the practice of osteopathic medicine in that it will fully implement the provisions of AB 56.

**b. Both immediate and long-term effects:**

The Board does not believe that the proposed regulation will have an immediate or long-term economic negative effect on the business of the practice of osteopathic medicine, nor will it have an economic effect on the public. The regulation will be necessary to ensure that all licensees are aware of the requirements set forth by AB 56 and promulgated by the Board.

**5. The methods used by the agency in determining the impact on small business:**

The Board sent e-mails regarding the proposed regulation and requesting information regarding whether the proposed regulation would impact small businesses to the Mountain West Better Business Bureau (Northern Nevada), the Better Business Bureau of Southern Nevada, multiple chambers of commerce offices in the State of Nevada, the City of Winnemucca, Great Basin College, the Rural Nevada Development Corporation, Nevada Small Business Development Center (at UNR), Churchill/Fallon Economic Development, the Nevada State Medical

Association, the Nevada Osteopathic Medical Association, the Washoe County Medical Society, the Clark County Medical Society, and the Nevada Academy of Physician Assistants. To date, the Board has received no responses indicating that the proposed regulation will impact small businesses.

**6. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation:**

Enforcement of the proposed regulation will not result in an increased cost to the Board.

**7. A description of and citation to any regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed regulation of the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments, in written form, to the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, 2275 Corporate Circle, Suite 210, Henderson, Nevada 89074. Written submissions must be received by the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine on or before 1:00 p.m., on April 13, 2026. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

**11. If the proposed regulation is a temporary regulation, each address at which the text of the regulation may be inspected and copied:**

The proposed regulation is not temporary.

12. **Statement Pursuant to NRS 233B.064(2):**

Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within thirty (30) days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

13. **Whether the proposed regulation establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee:**

The proposed regulation does increase existing fees for osteopathic physicians and physician assistants as the proposed fees set forth in the proposed regulation provide for biennial license renewals for certain licensees issued by the Board rather than the annual renewal of such licenses.

**SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT FOR PROPOSED  
AMENDMENTS TO NAC 633**

**Effective date of Regulation:**

Upon filing with the Nevada Secretary of State

**1. Background:**

The proposed amendments (modifications) to existing regulations in Nevada Administrative Code (“NAC”) Chapter 633 are necessary to ensure compliance of the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine (“the “Board”) with the requirements of newly passed Assembly Bill (“A.B.”) 56, signed into law in June 2025. These draft amendments (modifications) amend the following regulations set forth in NAC Chapter 633: NAC 633.250 regarding requirements for continuing education required for the renewal of an osteopathic physician’s license; NAC 633.285 regarding the period of validity of the physician assistant license and requirements for continuing education required for renewal of a physician assistant license; and NAC 633.335 regarding various licensing and renewal fees for licenses issued by the Board.

**2. Description of Solicitation:**

Copies of the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine’s (the “Board”) draft regulation and workshop notice were sent by U.S. Mail and/or emailed to persons who were known to have an interest in the subject of medical regulation, as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice. These documents were also made available on the website of the Board, available at <https://bom.nv.gov>, and the website of the State of Nevada’s Legislative Council Bureau (“LCB”), available at [Legislative Counsel Bureau \(state.nv.us\)](https://legislativecounselbureau.state.nv.us).

**3. Does the Proposed Regulation Impose a Direct and Significant Economic Burden Upon a Small Business or Directly Restrict the Formation, Operation, or Expansion of a Small Business? (NRS 233B.0608(1))**

No, the proposed amendments (modifications) to NAC 633 do not impose a direct and significant burden upon small business or directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a small business. These proposed regulation amendments (modifications) have been created to implement the provisions of Assembly Bill (“A.B.”) 56, which were passed in the 2025 Session of the Nevada Legislature.


**4. How Was That Conclusion Reached?**

November 14, 2025. The Board will update this Small Business Impact Statement should the Board receive more comment and input from affected businesses and individuals.

A REGULATION relating to osteopathic medicine; making various changes to conform to certain legislation providing for the biennial renewal of certain licenses issued by the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine rather than the annual renewal of such licenses; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

Assembly Bill No. 56 of the 2025 Legislative Session (A.B. 56) revised existing law to require: (1) an osteopathic physician or a physician assistant licensed by the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine to renew his or her license biennially rather than annually; and (2) an osteopathic physician to complete at least 40 hours of continuing education each biennium rather than at least 35 hours of continuing education each year. (NRS 633.433 and 633.471, as amended by sections 9 and 12, respectively, of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 98). **Sections 1 and 3** of this regulation incorporate those changes into existing regulations relating to continuing education for osteopathic physicians and physician assistants. Specifically: (1) **section 1** requires an osteopathic physician who is renewing his or her license after December 31, 2026, to have completed 40 hours of continuing education each biennium rather than 35 hours of continuing education each year; and (2) **section 3** requires a physician assistant who is renewing his or her license after December 31, 2027, to have completed 40 hours of continuing education each biennium rather than 20 hours of continuing education each year. **Sections 2, 4 and 7** of this regulation eliminate provisions governing continuing education

requirements that apply on or before December 31, 2026, and on or before December 31, 2027, respectively, on the dates when those provisions become obsolete.

A.B. 56 doubled the maximum amount of the fees that the Board may charge for the issuance and renewal of a license as an osteopathic physician or physician assistant so that the Board may continue to collect the same amount of fees when licenses are renewed biennially rather than annually. A.B. 56 also newly authorized the Board to charge fees for the renewal of a license as an anesthesiologist assistant. (NRS 633.501, as amended by section 18 of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 104) **Section 5** of this regulation accordingly doubles the current fees for the issuance or renewal of a license as an osteopathic physician or physician assistant and adds new fees for the renewal of a license as an anesthesiologist assistant. **Section 5** also adds a separate, specific fee for the simultaneous renewal of a license as a physician assistant who is also licensed by the Board of Medical Examiners. That separate fee is equal to the fee for the renewal of a license for a physician assistant who is not also licensed by the Board of Medical Examiners. **Section 6** of this regulation provides that the Board will prorate the fees set forth in **section 5** for the renewal of a license as a physician assistant during the transition from annual renewal of licensure to biennial renewal of licensure, as required by A.B. 56. (Section 20 of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 105)

**Section 1.** NAC 633.250 is hereby amended to read as follows:

3. As used in this section, “category 1A course” means a course of continuing medical education that is offered by a sponsor accredited to offer such a course by the American Osteopathic Association or the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education.

The license of a physician assistant that is renewed after December 31, 2025, may be renewed as provided in NRS 633.433, as amended by section 9 of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 98.*

2. An application to renew a license of a physician assistant must be submitted to the Board not less than 30 days before the expiration of the license. The application must be accompanied by the nonrefundable ~~{annual}~~ license renewal fee for a physician assistant prescribed in NAC 633.335.

3. A license of a physician assistant will not be renewed unless the physician assistant provides to the Board satisfactory proof of:

(a) Current certification by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants; and

(b) Completion by the physician assistant of :

*(1) If the physician assistant is renewing his or her license before December 31, 2027, at least 20 hours of continuing medical education as defined by the American Academy of Physician Associates, at least 2 hours of which must relate to the misuse and abuse of controlled substances, the prescribing of opioids or addiction.*

*(2) If the physician assistant is renewing his or her license on or after December 31, 2027, at least 40 hours of continuing medical education as defined by the American Academy of Physician Associates, at least 4 hours of which must relate to the misuse and abuse of controlled substances, the prescribing of opioids or addiction.*

4. A physician assistant shall notify the Board within 10 days after receipt of notification that his or her certification by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants was withdrawn.

5. An expired license of a physician assistant will not be renewed unless:

- (a) The requirements for renewal prescribed in this section are met; and
- (b) The Executive Director approves the renewal.

6. The Board will revoke a license that the Board has suspended if the license expires during the period of suspension and the physician assistant fails to renew the license pursuant to this section.

**Sec. 4.** NAC 633.285 is hereby amended to read as follows:

633.285 1. The license of a physician assistant ~~that is renewed on or before December 31, 2025, is valid for 1 year and may be renewed on or before the date set forth in the license. The~~

~~license of a physician assistant that is renewed after December 31, 2025,]~~ may be renewed as provided in NRS 633.433, as amended by section 9 of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 98.

2. An application to renew a license of a physician assistant must be submitted to the Board not less than 30 days before the expiration of the license. The application must be accompanied by the nonrefundable *biennial* license renewal fee for a physician assistant prescribed in NAC 633.335.

3. A license of a physician assistant will not be renewed unless the physician assistant provides to the Board satisfactory proof of:

(a) Current certification by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants; and

(b) Completion by the physician assistant of ~~†:~~

~~—— (1) If the physician assistant is renewing his or her license before December 31, 2027, at least 20 hours of continuing medical education as defined by the American Academy of Physician Associates, at least 2 hours of which must relate to the misuse and abuse of controlled substances, the prescribing of opioids or addiction.~~

4. A physician assistant shall notify the Board within 10 days after receipt of notification that his or her certification by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants was withdrawn.

  - (b) The Executive Director approves the renewal.
  
6. The Board will revoke a license that the Board has suspended if the license expires during the period of suspension and the physician assistant fails to renew the license pursuant to this section.

The Board will charge and collect a fee for fingerprints submitted to the Board pursuant to NRS 633.309 that is equal to the total amount of the fees charged by any local agencies of law enforcement, the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the handling of the fingerprints of an applicant and issuance of the reports of criminal histories.

3. The Board will reduce by one-half the appropriate application and initial license fee prescribed in subsection 1 for an applicant who ~~is~~:

~~—(a) Applies~~ *applies* for an initial license as an osteopathic physician , ~~or~~ a physician assistant ~~that will expire less than 6 months after the date of issuance of the license; or~~

~~—(b) Applies for an initial license as~~ *or* an anesthesiologist assistant that will expire less than 12 months after the date of issuance of the license.

**Sec. 6.** This regulation is hereby amended by adding thereto the following transitory language which has the force and effect of law but which will not be codified in the Nevada Administrative Code:

Notwithstanding the amendatory provisions of section 5 of this regulation, the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine will prorate the fee set forth in NAC 633.335, as amended by section 5 of this regulation, in the manner required by subsection 2 of section 20 of Assembly Bill No. 56, chapter 18, Statutes of Nevada 2025, at page 105, for the renewal on or before December 31, 2026, of a license as a physician assistant which was held by a licensee on December 31, 2025.

**Sec. 7.** 1. This section and sections 1, 3, 5 and 6 of this regulation become effective on the date on which this regulation is approved by the Legislative Commission and filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to NRS 233B.070.

2. Section 2 of this regulation becomes effective on January 1, 2027.

3. Section 4 of this regulation becomes effective on January 1, 2028.
